Insurance Update, July 2018, By Dick Tombrink, NW Regional Director.

At this time, I am sure you are aware of the incident that happened in California last September.

One of our branch members was participating in a local parade, and accidently ran into the back of a Bentley car, denting the bumper, in the parade. Since our insurance does not have participant liability, the claim was denied by our insurance carrier. We do not have coverage for an accident involving another participant in a community parade whether they are an EDGETA Member or not. As you know, we also do not have coverage for an incident involving another EDGE member at an EDGE show.

E.D.G.E. has found an Insurance carrier that will provide "participant liability coverage" for us, both for the case of one of our members participating in a community parade and also for an incident involving another EDGETA member at our shows. This is really good news for us; it fills a gap that we have not been able to cover before. However, it does come with an increase in cost. Presently we are paying \$8 per member per year for insurance in addition to the \$4 for the EDGETA national dues, for a total of \$12. This coverage will cost an additional \$5 per member per year, for a total of \$17. To me, this is a small price to pay for the additional coverage we will be getting. There is a problem adopting this policy at this time. It will require those members who have paid their dues this year to pay an additional \$5. This can get complicated for the membership chairman to collect the additional \$5 from those individuals. As those collecting membership dues know it is hard to get some members to pay their dues. The EDGETA BOD felt it would be better to wait until next year to adopt this policy. Then the dues to EDGETA would be \$4 for the National Dues and \$13 for the insurance, for a total of \$17. Adoption of this new insurance policy will provide us with the coverage we do not have now. That is coverage for an incident involving another participant of a community parade and of a member to member incident. This fills a "doughnut hole" that we now have. Since we have some time before this policy would be adopted next April, we would like for EDGETA members to contact their directors or contact me at 406-967-6687 with any comments or questions you have regarding this new proposed policy. We would like to have your feedback. Dick Tombrink.

Looks like we may have to raise our membership dues by \$5.00 next year, to cover the additional Insurance costs. Bob Hanson – President
