

A must see show out of the Yuma, Az. area, is the *Southwest Forgotten Iron Show*, put on by Branch 206. This show is scheduled and open (one day) to the public on Sat. January 16th from 8 AM – 4 PM, located in Wellton, Az.

Wellton is located 29 miles east of Yuma, Az.

A short one hour drive south, from Quartzsite, Az.

A new Hit & Miss Engine Show is being reborn again at Quartzsite, Az. The show will take place at "The Main Event" area, at the west end of town, and is scheduled to take place on January 19th – 25th. As you can see, this follows the Forgotten Iron Show out of Wellton.

A word from our Vice-President of EDGE&TA, Don Young.

Winter is here and soon we will be starting a new show year. This past year has been a busy one. I have attended several engine/tractor shows, some included with air, truck, car shows, strawberry and pumpkin festivals. The SW Regional Show branch 184, was held in the Village of Corrales, New Mexico in October. It was a great show and Safety was their number one priority. The fire chief/paramedic with his fire truck was available on sight during the duration of the show. There were fire extinguishers everywhere. There were a variety of engines, tractors, equipment on display including an Emerson Brantingham Big 4 tractor from Monticello, UT. It is one of a very few still in existence. The weather was good except for rain each day. I was told when it started to rain the first day, wait five minutes. In five minutes the rain stopped as it did each day. The evening meal after the Saturday show was fantastic. The final morning of the show there was a farmer's market with produce for sale that was grown locally. The same weekend was the International Balloon Fiesta held in nearby Albuquerque. Over 700 colorful and various shaped balloons from seventeen countries and forty-four states filled the sky. Close to 1,000,000 spectators were on hand. It was impossible for us to get a room even months in advance. A husband and wife, members of branch 184 graciously put us up for several days and treated us like royalty. We can't thank them enough. We were able to sit in their driveway each morning at daybreak and view hundreds of balloons passing overhead. To top it all our host took us to the Al Unser Sr. museum. He introduced us to Al. During our conversation I mentioned to Al, I don't reckon that you have much, interest in tractors as they only go ten miles per hour. We spent several hours there viewing all the cars, engines, tires and all the memorabilia on display. Earlier this month our club had a guided tour of the Justice Brothers Museum in California to view the many race cars, motorcycles and airplane. At one point we met with Ed Justice Jr. He explained and pointed things out on his favorite race car.

Several weeks ago, I went thru all of the branch websites and found many without safety officers listed or not currently updated. In 2016, please update. Check your webpage for errors, making sure your information is correct. In the past there have been emails and correspondence returned because of incorrect addresses. 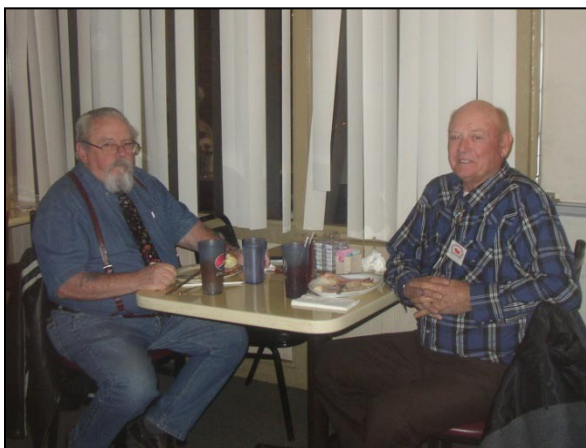
