**PURCHASING DIRECTOR: David Pickus reported approximately \$600 in profits for the Fire-up/Swap meet today, after expenses. David said, not bad for 4 or 5 hours of hard work....Great Swap meet.**

**LIBRARIAN/WEB MASTER: Scott Wachlin not present.**

## DOWN – HOME – COOKING

This is a collection of recipes by Rusty Relic's Members Past & Present.

### SPICY KETCHUP

¼ cup ketchup.

2 teaspoons lemon juice.

½ teaspoon chili powder.

½ teaspoon Worcestershire sauce.

¼ teaspoon hot sauce.

Whisk together the ketchup, lemon juice, chili powder, Worcestershire sauce and hot sauce together, until combined. Ready to serve.

### JALAPENO POPPERS

20 fresh jalapenos peppers, 2 to 3 inches long.

Two 8-ounce packages of cream cheese, slightly softened in Microwave.

1 pound of thin (regular) bacon, slices cut in half.

Special equipment: latex gloves for handling peppers, optional, and 40 wooden toothpicks.

-Pre-heat the oven to 275 degrees F. Set a wire rack over a baking sheet.

-If you have them, slip on some latex gloves for the pepper prep.

-Cut the jalapenos peppers in half lengthwise. With a spoon, remove the seeds and white membranes (the source of the heat).

-Smear cream cheese into each jalapeno half and then wrap with a bacon piece (1/2 slice). Secure by sticking a toothpick through the middle.

-Place on the wire rack in the baking sheet.

Bake until the bacon is sizzling and done. 1 hour 15 minutes.

Serve immediately, or they're also great at room temperature.
