OLD BUSINESS: No old business.

NEW BUSINESS:

President Bob Hanson called for a Directors Meeting today at 12:30 PM to discuss the findings of the purposed New Awning, for the large Fairbanks Engine. Directors present, Bob Hanson, Bill Forbes, Ron Hanson, Robert Meyer, David Pickus and Luci Pickus. They discussed the Pros & Cons of the six proposals submitted to us, and mapped out the area which the Canopy will set. The findings were then presented to the club for their approval.

It was discussed that we will purchase a new 36 ft. long by 18 ft. wide, by 13 ft. 6 inches high (at the peak), 14 gauge steel carport, Manufactured by American Steel Car Ports.

It will be a free standing car port with the back and one side covered in steel. The other side will be next to the Clubs Conex for added support and protection.

The entire carport will be installed and guaranteed by the Manufacturer.

We will be placing the order through a local Distributer.

The cost of the total installation is approximately \$4100. Including sales tax.

A motion by Ben Drake and a second by Don Nave to purchase the Carport and not to exceed \$x,xxx. Motion passed unanimously.

Del. and installation is estimated to be 4 to 6 weeks, after receipt of order.

David Pickus has been in contact with the land owner Fred Frakes, and will need his final approval and OK, before we place the order.

The Carport is portable, and if for some unforeseen reason, we could move the entire Carport, to another location.

Ron Zega made a motion to close the meeting and David Williams second the motion. Motion passed and the meeting closed at 2:50 PM.

We had 27 members and guests present.

ORANGE CHEESE SALAD

1 3-oz. pkg. Orange Jello.	1 sm. Can (8-oz) Crushed Pineapple.
1 sm. Carton Cottage Cheese (small curd).	1 9-oz. Tub Cool Whip.
	1 c. Miniature Marshmallows.
1 can Mandarin Oranges, drained.	

Whip cottage cheese in large mixing bowl. Sprinkle with dry orange Jello, set aside until Jello becomes moist. Mix and add drained mandarin oranges and pineapple. Fold in Cool Whip that has been partially thawed. Toss together until mixed. Chill and serve. This is a delightful salad simple and easy to make and goes over very good at buffet dinners.
