DOWN - HOME - COOKING

This is a collection of recipes by Rusty Relic's Members Past & Present.

MUSHROOM PINWHEELS

1 tube crescent rolls 1 tsp. chopped onion

3 oz. cream cheese, softened Cream of mushroom soup, opt.

4 oz. can mushrooms Salt & pepper to taste

Beat cream cheese until smooth. Add chopped mushrooms, onions, salt & pepper. Form 2 rectangles with crescent rolls. Spread on filling and roll jellyroll-style. Freeze firm! Cut into ½-inch slices. Dip top in beaten egg. Bake on well-greased cookie sheet at 400 degrees for 8 minutes on second shelf in oven. Serve hot.

GARDEN CHICKEN SOUP

6 c. water ½ c. sliced carrots 2 c. tomato juice 1/ c. chopped celery

1 c. peeled, diced potato 2 T. low-sodium chicken flavored

1 c. chopped onionbouillon granules1 c. whole kernel corn1 tsp. garlic powder1 c. cooked, drained Lima beans1½ tsp. Worcester sauce

34 c. cooked chicken breast

(Skinned before cooking without salt)

Combine all ingredients in large Dutch oven. Cover and bring to a boil. Reduce heat and simmer for 45 minutes. Simple garnishes such as sprinkling of fresh herbs or green onions, a slice of lemon or teaspoon of nonfat sour cream gives soups an added touch of flavor and color.
